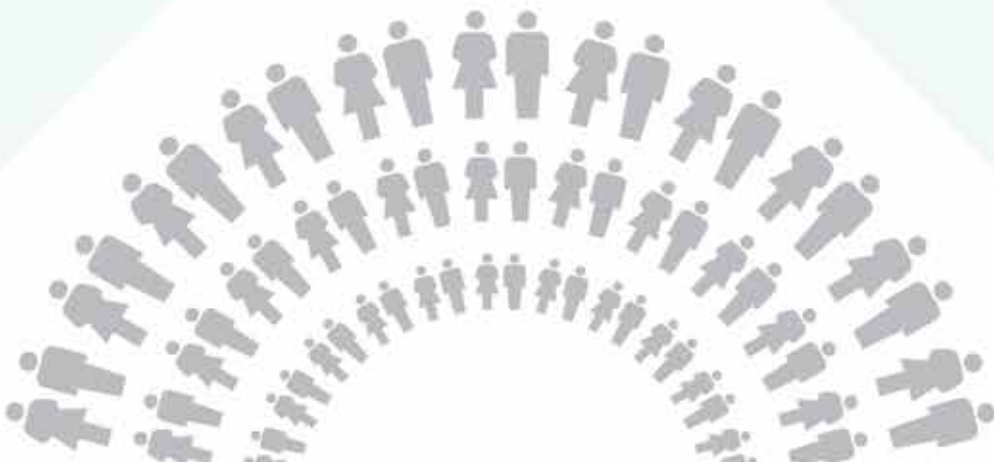

Our four schools—St. Arnold School and Divine Word School—are shaping the future of over 4,000 students. On the livelihood front, we have made significant strides in creating economic opportunities and fostering self-reliance. Our projects Sustainable Transformation through Agriculture Nurturing & Development (STtAND) and Leveraging Agriculture Nurturing & Development (LAND) have delivered remarkable breakthroughs among the farmers of Tripura. Today, 32 farmers' clubs are actively involved in both farm and non-farm activities, receiving livelihood support, training, and exposure to new opportunities.

We are also deeply committed to promoting an inclusive society in Tripura. With the support of CBM, OBS has been able to care for 350 children with disabilities and 50 children without disabilities. We have also advanced inclusive education in mainstream government schools through teacher sensitization and training programs. The creation of Inclusive Parents Groups (IPG) and livelihood programs has been a resounding success in improving the quality of life for children and their families. Comprehensive socio-economic and health interventions have further supported our goal of building an inclusive society.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to our Chairman, Rev. Fr. Jeevan Kennady, SVD, and all the Governing Board members of OBS for their unwavering support. Thank you for your continued trust and belief in our work.

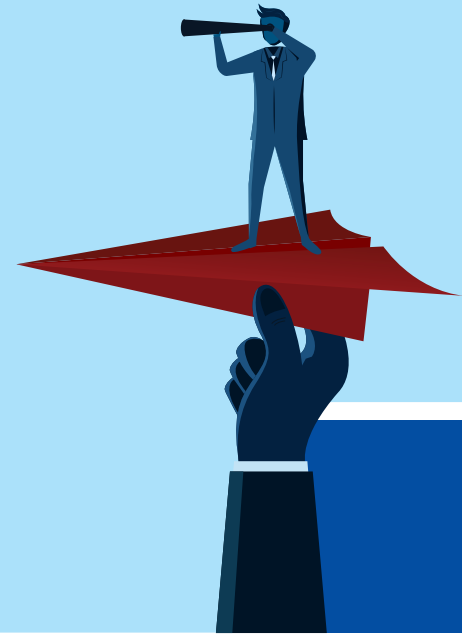

ORGANIZATION PROFILE

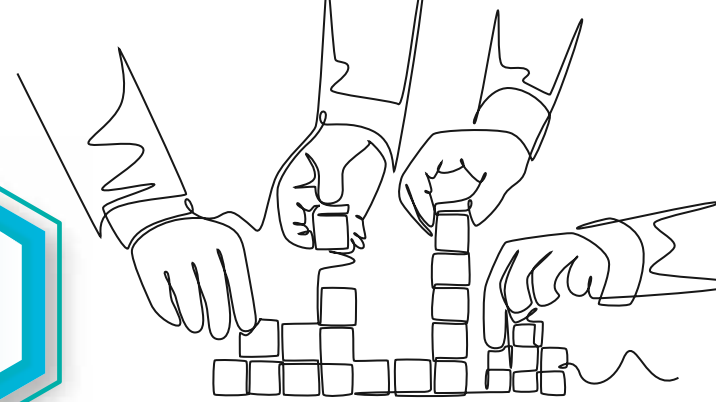
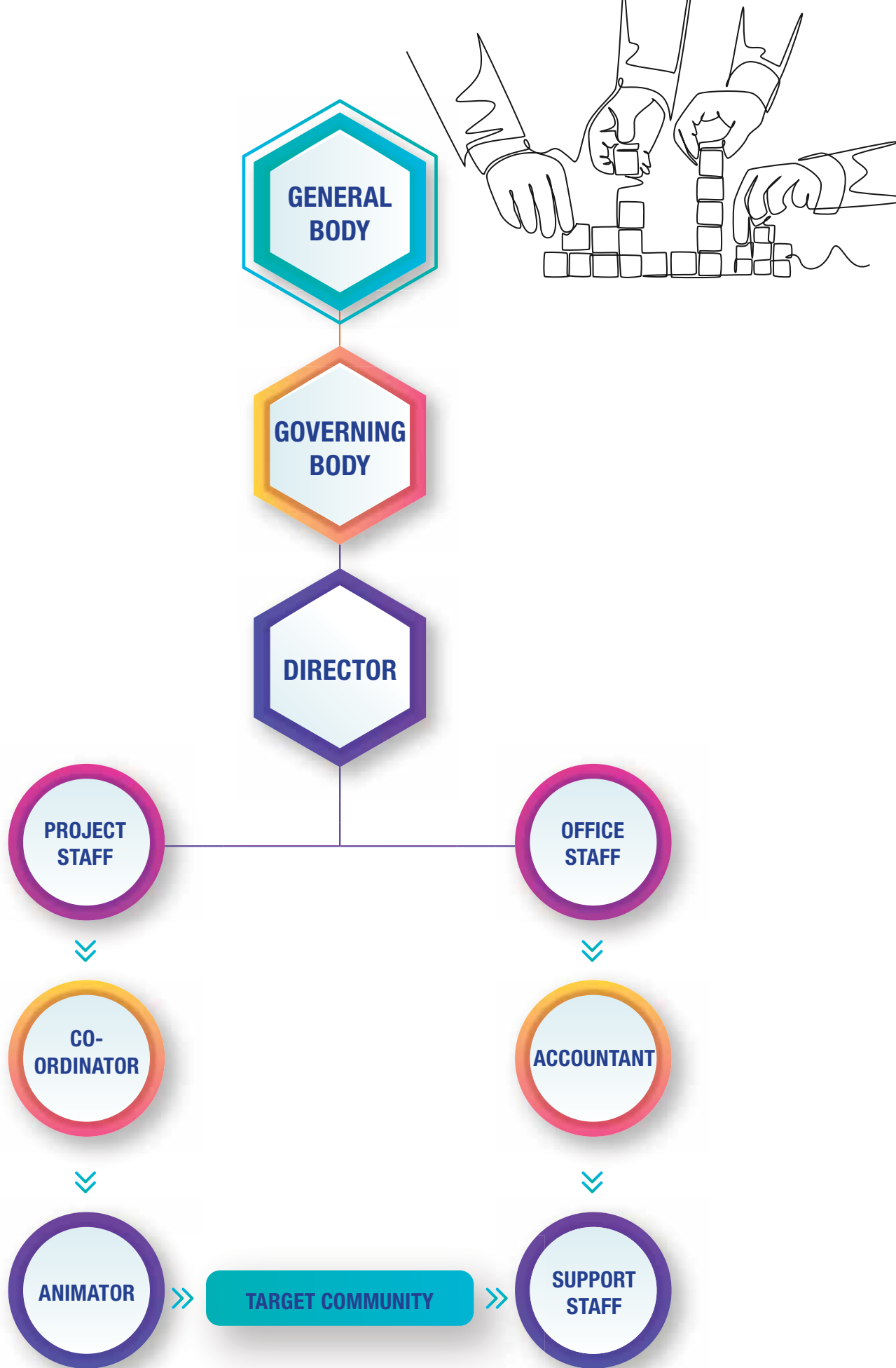

PROGRAMME AND PROJECTS

1. EDUCATIONAL SUPPORT

The Oisho Bani Society has made a profound impact on the socio-economic and cultural landscape of tribal communities in Northeast India through its dedicated efforts in providing education to the underprivileged. With a focus on reaching tribal children in remote, rural areas, the Society's Education Ministry has benefitted over 4,000 children, enabling them to access quality education that would otherwise be out of reach due to geographic barriers.



In Ganganagar, a village in Tripura, several families supported to operate private hostels to accommodate students attending St. Arnold's School. One such caregiver, Mr. Sujit Kumar, manages a hostel that serves as his primary means of livelihood. Recognizing the need for better living conditions for the students, Mr. Jaibu Mathew approached Oisho Bani Society for assistance, highlighting the necessity for cots and mattresses to improve the hostel's facilities.

In response, the society's board members swiftly approved a grant of Rs. 130,000 for the purchase of these essential items. This intervention has significantly enhanced the quality of life for the students while alleviating the financial burden on Mr. Sujit Kumar. This initiative exemplifies

Oisho Bani Society's ongoing commitment to improving the welfare of vulnerable communities.



Miss Kaikho Lily, a resident of Senapati, Manipur, has consistently demonstrated exceptional academic excellence despite facing significant financial challenges. After successfully completing her high school and higher secondary education with high distinctions, she encountered difficulties in pursuing further studies due to limited financial resources. Recognizing her dedication and ambition, the Oisho Bani Society council promptly approved financial assistance to cover her educational expenses. These funds were transferred to Green Land Nursing College in Senapati, enabling Kaikho Lily to pursue her dream of a career in nursing. This support not only eased her financial burden but also reaffirmed our commitment to empowering deserving individuals through education.



Mr. Pradip Kumar Minj, a dedicated farmer residing in Agartala, Tripura, works tirelessly to provide for his elderly parents, wife, and three children. In addition to his farming activities, he manages a small poultry farm to supplement the family income. Despite his relentless efforts, meeting the financial demands of his family, particularly for his eldest son's education, has been a significant challenge.

Recognizing his son's exceptional academic potential, as he currently excels in higher secondary school, Mr. Pradip approached Nabin Roshan Lakra, the director of Oisho Bani Niketan, for assistance. Understanding the importance of education and Mr. Pradip's commitment to his family's well-being, the Regional Council promptly approved a grant of Rs. 20,000 to cover his son's educational expenses. This support not only alleviates the financial burden on Mr. Pradip but also reinforces our mission to empower families through education.

2. MEDICAL SUPPORT



Miss Bina Daimary, a dedicated domestic staff at SVD House in Guwahati for the past five years, faced significant challenges regarding her dental health. With the need for dental braces to correct her alignment, along with required extractions and root canal treatment, Bina sought help from Dr. Kaumudi Roy Chaudhuri, who outlined the necessary procedures. Due to her financial constraints, Bina approached Ivan Vas, the Rector of SVD House, for assistance. Recognizing the urgency of her situation, the board members swiftly approved financial aid of Rs. 55,000. This amount was directly transferred to Dr. Kaumudi Roy Chaudhuri's account to cover Bina's dental treatments. This intervention not only addresses Bina's immediate health concerns but also reflects our ongoing commitment to supporting the well-being of our staff members.



Miss Bina Narzary, works as the domestic staff at SVD House in Guwahati for the past two years, encountered significant dental challenges that impacted her overall well-being. Her front teeth were misaligned, necessitating braces for correction, along with additional extractions and root canal treatments to address other dental issues. In her pursuit of a solution, Bina consulted Dr. Kaumudi Roy Chaudhuri, who recommended braces to improve her dental alignment and health. However, due to her financial limitations, Bina approached Ivan Vas, the Rector of SVD House, for assistance. Recognizing her dedication and years of service, Ivan Vas brought her request to the governing body for consideration. This case underscores our commitment to supporting the health and welfare of our staff, ensuring they receive the necessary care to thrive both personally and professionally.



Mrs. Marchila Basumatari, a widow and dedicated daily wage worker from Udalguri, Assam, faces significant challenges in supporting her four children while managing various menial jobs. Despite her relentless efforts, she often struggles to meet their educational expenses. Recently, Mrs. Basumatari experienced a health setback that required hospitalization due to a severe fever. Recognizing the urgent need for financial assistance to cover her medical costs, she approached Francis Fernandes, the superior at Janssen Youth Center in Tezpur, for help. In response to her situation, the board members acted swiftly, approving a transfer of Rs.15,000 directly to Mrs. Basumatari's bank account. This timely support proved to be a crucial lifeline for her and her family during a difficult time, demonstrating our ongoing commitment to assist those in need within our community.



In our commitment to fostering a compassionate workplace, we would like to highlight the case of Mr. Pdiangmon Lamare, a dedicated professional driver at SVD House Garal for the past year. Recently, Mr. Lamare faced a challenging personal crisis when his three-year-old son required hospitalization. Understanding the urgency of the situation, the administration acted swiftly to approve emergency financial aid of Rs 12,000. This support was promptly deposited into Mr. Lamare's bank account, alleviating his financial burden and allowing him to focus on his son's recovery.

This act of kindness not only exemplifies the solidarity and care within our community but also reaffirms our commitment to supporting our employees during critical times. At SVD House, we believe that timely assistance can make a significant difference in the lives of those in need, and we remain dedicated to ensuring that all our employees receive the support they require.



Mathuram Daimary, a resident of Kokrajhar, Assam, has long struggled with the responsibility of caring for his elderly parents while navigating the challenges of unstable employment due to his incomplete high school education. Recently, Mathuram faced a severe health crisis, being hospitalized with a high fever and chest infections. Unable to afford the medical expenses, he sought assistance from Maxim Rodrigues. Recognizing the urgency, the governing members swiftly approved financial support. Mathuram and his family received Rs. 30,000 for his medical treatment, providing crucial aid during this difficult time.



Francis Quadras has been an integral part of the Oisho Bani Society. Recently, Mr. Quadras faced a challenging period as he grappled with both physical and mental health issues, exacerbated by the absence of immediate support. In need of medical care and recovery, he was admitted to Snehalaya Charitable Trust. Recognizing the severity of his situation and his contributions to the community, Francis reached out to Clement Quadras for financial assistance.

The governing body responded swiftly with compassion and approved a financial aid package totaling Rs 40,000, which was promptly transferred to Snehalaya Charitable Trust to cover his medical expenses and support his recovery. The assistance provided by the board members brought immense relief to Mr. Francis Quadras, who expressed profound gratitude for the timely support.

Bishu Debbarma, a resident of Kamaranga, Tripura, suffered a debilitating stroke that left him paralyzed for three months. During this challenging period, his daughter, Miss. Christina Debbarma, took on the responsibility of caring for him, alongside managing their three school-going siblings. The family faced considerable financial strain due to the high cost of Bishu's medical treatment. Recognizing the urgency of their situation, Miss. Christina Debbarma reached out to Nabin Roshan Lakra for assistance. Moved by compassion, the board members swiftly approved Rs 15,000 in immediate financial assistance for Bishu Debbarma's medical expenses. This support was crucial in alleviating the financial burden on the family during a time of crisis.

3. REHABILITATION SUPPORT

This fund allocation was dedicated exclusively to support the social and charitable initiatives undertaken by the Society. These initiatives encompassed a broad spectrum of activities aimed at improving the lives of individuals and families in need across the northeast region. We are happy and satisfied that these initiatives had a healing effect on the lives of individuals and families.



Mr. Daud Munda and Mr. Swapan Debbarma, residents of Kamaranga, Tripura, faced severe financial hardship due to their impoverished circumstances. They struggled to sustain their families through daily wage labour. Their houses, particularly the roof, was in a deteriorated state and urgently needed repairs.

Recognizing their plight, they appealed to Fr. Arun Minj for assistance in obtaining tin sheets to repair their house. Fr. Arun Minj took their plea to the President, which responded with a compassionate grant of Rs 60,000 for the repair work. With this funding secured, tin sheets were purchased promptly from Tripureshwari Enterprise. The funds were transferred directly from the Society's account to the shop, ensuring swift acquisition of the materials.



Mr. George Kandulna resides in Solabasti, Tezpur, near Janssen Youth Centre. He works as a private school teacher and recently faced a significant personal loss with the passing of his wife. George had initiated the construction of his house but encountered setbacks along the way. Challenges such as his own illness, the sudden demise of his wife, and the ongoing educational expenses for his daughters hindered the completion of the construction project. Moved by George's

plight and the sincerity of his request, Mr. Francis Fernandes brought the matter to the attention of the Society Administration. Understanding the critical nature of George's situation and the importance of stable housing for his family, the administration promptly approved Rs. 50,000 as social assistance to facilitate the completion of his house construction. With the financial support provided, George successfully completed the construction of his home, a significant step forward for his family's stability and well-being.



Mrs. Magreta Musahari resides in Ambagaon, Tezpur, along with her husband, three children, and elderly parents. Their living conditions are challenging, as they currently reside in a makeshift tin shed without a secure foundation. Determined to improve their living situation, they had begun constructing a small house, but their progress was halted due to financial constraints. Realizing the urgent need for stable housing, Mrs. Magreta Musahari reached out to the Oisho Bani Society for assistance.

Understanding the family's plight, the Regional Council swiftly intervened and approved Rs. 45,000 in social aid to help complete the construction of their home.



With this timely support, Mrs. Magreta Musahari and her family were able to finalize the construction of their house, providing them with a more secure and stable living environment.



Mr. Johney Ekka, a resident of Baksa, Bhaganpara, Assam, comes from a humble background where he supports his elderly parents and younger siblings. Johney had to leave high school to take care of his family, especially his father who has been suffering from various illnesses, rendering him unable to work. Last year, their challenges escalated when Johney's

mother was diagnosed with bone cancer, necessitating ongoing treatment at the Northeastern Cancer Hospital in Guwahati, Assam. Despite these hardships, Johney persevered in his efforts to build a house for his family. Recognizing the severity of the Ekka family's circumstances, the board members swiftly approved Rs 60,000 in social aid. This financial assistance was intended to help Johney complete the construction of his family's house and contribute towards his mother's medical expenses.

4. STtAND Project

Activities "Sustainable Transformation through Agriculture Nurturing & Development" (STtAND) project is implemented in Kamalpur sub-division in Dhalai District of Tripura. Impact of the project is that the tribal families under Kamalpur Subdivision in Dhalai District in Tripura, increased food security throughout the year and adopted organic farming and animal husbandry as sustainable livelihood. The following activities have been completed during the reporting period.



1. Training on organic farming and live stock rearing
2. Sensitization programme on available government schemes for the farmers
3. Training on mushroom cultivation and distribution of spawns.
4. Livelihood support to 16 famers' clubs
5. World Environment day celebration cum plantation drive
6. Farmers' day celebration.
7. Linkage with development agencies and Govt. Departments.

5. LAND Project

“Leveraging Agriculture Nurturing & Development” (LAND) project is operational in and around Khmulwng, Jampuijala villages under West Tripura and Sepahijala District. This project aims at improving the quality of life of farmers and ensuring food security by promoting organic farming and other allied activities like animal husbandry, horticulture fish farming ect.

Activities

1. Training on organic farming and live stock rearing
2. Sensitization programme on available government schemes for the farmers
3. Training on mushroom cultivation and distribution of spawns.
4. Livelihood support to 16 famers' clubs
5. World Environment day celebration cum plantation drive
6. Farmers' day celebration.
7. Linkage with development agencies and Govt. Departments.



6. Family Quality of Life: A project to support children with and without disabilities and their families in the state of Tripura

The overall objective of the project is; To improve the quality of life of children including children with disabilities and their families through holistic development.

The specific objective of the project, "To improve the participation of 400 children with and without disabilities and their families in Health, Education, Livelihoods and Social Inclusion activities in two blocks namely Dukli, Old Agartala and Agartala Municipality Corporation of West Tripura District. Principal activities are such as, Screening and Medical camps for the Children with Disability (CwD) and without disability, Assistance for Entitlement of CwDs, Awareness on Inclusive Education and Capacity building and Livelihood based trainings.

Activities

1. Screening and Medical camps for the Children with Disability (CwD) and without disability
2. Assistance for Entitlement of CwDs
3. Awareness on Inclusive Education
4. Capacity building and Livelihood based trainings.
5. Nutritional supplement programs.





7. ANIMATION AND CAPACITY BUILDING.

7.1. Leadership Training Program

Oisho Bani Society, Ambassa organized a one day seminar for the village leaders of Ambassa. Around 50 participants from different villages joined in the workshop. Ivan DSilva the treasurer of the Society welcomed all the associates for the one day seminar on Leadership; especially he welcomed Mr. Paul Sangma an engineer by profession the main resource person of the day. He took a practical session on leadership with the role play. It was liked and appreciated by all. It was a renewal program for them to rejuvenate their qualities of Leadership. Ivan DSilva, thanked the resource persons and all the participants for their presence and concluded the session with lunch.



7.2. International Women's Day Celebration

To commemorate the International women's day AmbassaDeanery organized a one day seminar for women in Ambassa. Women from 3 Sub-Divisions, namely Kamalpur, Gandachara and Ambassa under Dhalai District around 94 of them had gathered for one day celebration. Maxim Redrigues the President of the Oisho Bani Society welcomed them. In his talk he hailed the contribution of women in the families, and in the Societies. After the inaugural address all women got together for the class and discussion. Ms. Sushila from Gandachara Community gave class on 'Gender Equality' Mrs. Kimi Halam, the president of the Ambassa Deanery, called on women to have an action plan for this year. Accordingly they had discussion on this issue and they prioritized three main points they are, to make the family a model family, education of the children, and cleanliness. Ivan DSilva the treasurer of the OBS gave a talk on the action plan points. He said, "when you are more spiritual oriented, you also need to be action oriented. There are so many unpleasant things happening in our society, how can we tackle them?" Towards the end, there were group song competitions and with lunch the gathering was concluded.



7.3. Youth Animation Program

Three days of animation program for the youth was organized at Lalchori, Ambassa. There were 29 participants from different villages to attend the course which was organized in the parish hall on October 20, 23 & 24. Dr. Asok Debbarma educated the youths on various topics on health & hygiene. Such as: Menstruation and how it takes place, early pregnancy and risk, Abortion and breast cancer etc. On the third day Mr. Indrajit Sangma gave a realistic class on the importance of SCC and family. Mr. Prabath Marak & LataMarak the couples imparted education on family life and upbringing of the children. Three days of classes ended with fruitful discussion. The chief organizer was Ivan D'Silva the centre in charge.



7.4. Brotherhood through Sports

Ganganagar is a remote village of Dhalai District. It is the habitat of many Reang people the one of the major tribes of Tripura. Reang people are also considered as Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group of India. They are the most backward in education, economic development, livelihood etc. The center in charge Jaibu Mathew conducted the football match to bring the youths of Ganganager together. Youths are easily attracted towards the sports and it becomes the platform to bring them together to foster brotherhood and say no to social evils like, drugs, robbery, substance abuse, eve teasing etc. Sports is one of the platforms for the youths where lots of awareness is given to them through various key persons.



8. Revolving fund for self-reliance follow up program

Oisho Bani Society, Ambassa organized a half day seminar for the revolving fund beneficiaries. In the year 2022 there were 35 people who were given money to buy livestock. From the Arnold Revolving Fund Rupees 406000 (four lakhs six thousand) was dispersed to the beneficiaries. In this meeting there were 25 beneficiaries and they shared their success stories. The Revolving Fund was created by the OBS Ambassa in 2019 during the Corona period to make poor people self-reliant (Atma Nirbar). Since then it has been working well and people have benefited from it. Mrs. Jamindar Daya Molsom from Raipasa village shared that, “she reared country chicken called Kadaknath which are more expensive in the market than other local chicken”. She said, “They fetched quite a lot of money for her and she could return the money back which she had borrowed without any difficulties”. Mr. Philip Hrangkhawl said, “I had borrowed 20,000 from the revolving fund to buy the machine for making the rubber sheet and I need not go far away to make sheet”. He further said, “I charge others Rs. 3 per sheet and I have profited much through this financial help”. There are many more such stories shared by the beneficiaries. Revolving fund committee members thanked the beneficiaries for making use of the money for the right purpose and for self-reliance.



9. Dialogue and Peace Initiative

Oisho Bani Society is in the fore front to respect all the religions and promote brotherhood among them. Various religious meetings are being organized on different occasion to pay tribute the richness of the each religion. The religious heads of Hindu, Muslism, Christian, Bahai, Sansarik, Jorastrasm, Buddhism etc. come together for the noble cause. Oisho Bani Society is the member of interreligious dialogue. Oisho Bani Society takes active participation in interreligious dialogue.



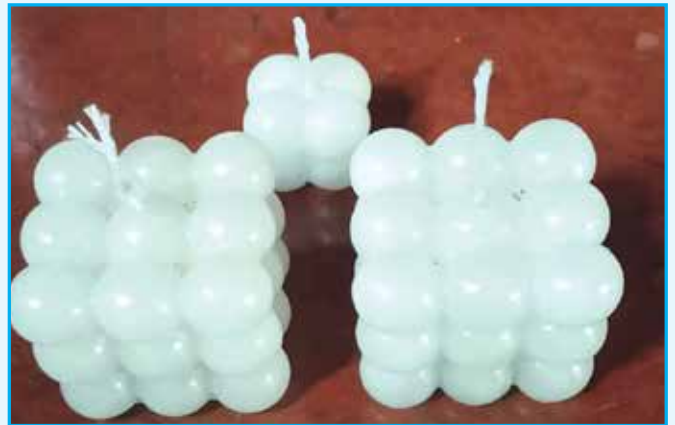
10. PROMOTION OF ENVIRONMENT

Oisho Bani Society celebrated the Vanamahotsav (Green Sunday) in different centres of animation and institutions of the society. Prior to this plants were collected from the forest department nursery. The forest department was kind enough to provide us with different types of plants, such as; Agor, Champa, Bamboos, neem, Jack fruit and Jongcha. Some of the plants were collected from the centre nursery, which was monitored by forest department. It being the multi coloured day there was all the reason to celebrate the Green Day. More than 1000 people collected the plants to place in the ground at their home compound. Over the years the awareness of greenery and a safe environment has become the priority for the people even though they stay in their villages.



11. LIVELIHOOD SUPPORT

Over 150 people have been supported financially by OBS ranging from Rs. 5000 to Rs. 30000 to take up different livelihood activities like; Piggery, poultry, fishery, petty shops, Mushroom cultivation, tailoring training etc to earn their income to improve their economic conditions and family quality life. For the interested women group, there is 3months tailoring training program so that they can earn their livelihood being at home.







12. EXPOSURE PROGRAMME FOR FARMERS

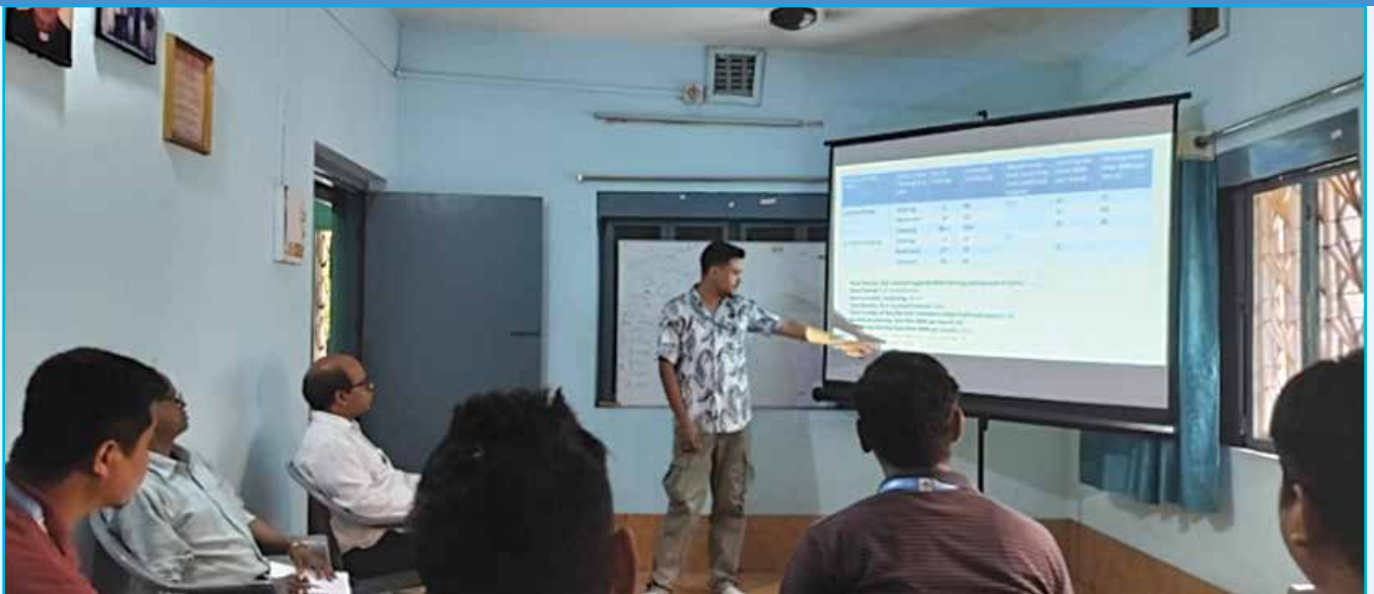
Oisho Bani Society (OBS) organized an exposure program supported by Misan Cara for the farmers for gaining firsthand experience and inter learning. 45 farmers from Champak Nagar and Jampujala area under West Tripura and Jampujala District took part in the exposure. The farmers visited All Garo Hills Cooperative Society in Tura. Fr. Nabin Roshan Lakra the Director of Oisho Bani Society welcomed the farmers, Fr. Sunny, the Director of AGHCS, Tura gave an orientation talk and arranged different animators for guiding the farmers. The farmers visited, cashewnut production unit, ginger production unit, cashnut garden, animal husbandry unit etc. Farmers had good exposure program and learnt a lot.



VI. MONTHLY REVIEW MEETING

At the end of the months OBS holds monthly review meeting for the purpose of close monitoring of the members and the activities. Keeping in view of proper control and monitoring system of OBS, every month there was monthly review meeting called by the director. It gave the opportunity for all the members of LAND, StAND and CBM to present their activities as well as future plans. 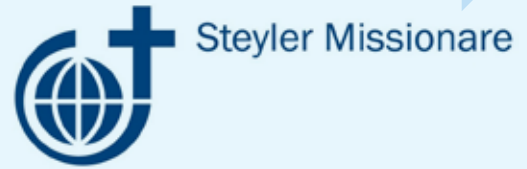
